-- The Stove Project

Before - people place three stones on the ground, make a fire and cook. Burn injury risk is high in children. Smoke inhalation respiratory diseases prevail.

After - prefabricated wood burning stoves consume 80% less wood. Exhaust takes the smoke out of the house and the surface is elevated, thus preventing injuries.



-- The Housing Project

Adobe homes are being built on top of a cement foundations. Two-room houses with a porch to include an ONIL plancha stove, a PILA or a water collecting area, and electricity.

This project will build homes to rescue abused Mayan women with young children and provide a safe place for them.

Cost \$2,400

These wood houses were built by our missionaries in the summer of 2011.

In the future, adobe homes will be constructed so that residents can participate in the build.
